QLD has become home to more methamphetamine drug labs over the last 20 years than any other State. Ice and speed are the addictive and dangerous illicit drugs available on the streets. Efforts to stop methamphetamines crossing the border have been so successful that some people are cooking their own. Look at the police unit working to keep suburbs safe. Last year QLD Police shut down 330 methamphetamine labs. Police found cold and flu tablets containing pseudoephedrine. Suzi Morris, Lives Lived Well says there are side effects like aggression, poor impulse control, risk taking behaviour, and drug induced psychosis.
